Motor Carrier Taxes

In order to operate in the State of Wisconsin, both domestic and foreign corporations must register with the Secretary of State. Wisconsin stock corporations (domestic) are required to become incorporated in the state, whereas foreign corporations are required to register for a certificate of authority. Filing and registration fees are as follows:

DOMESTIC CORPORATIONS:

Articles of Incorporation - The filing fee for articles is one cent for each authorized share with a minimum fee of \$90 and a maximum of \$10,000.

Amended or Restated Articles - Fee is \$40 plus one cent for each additional authorized share created by the amendment or restatement, with a maximum fee of \$10,000.

Articles of dissolution - Fee of \$20.

FOREIGN CORPORATIONS:

Application for Certificate of Authority - Fee of \$100 plus \$2 for every \$1,000 of its capital exceeding \$60,000 employed or to be employed in the state, as shown on the application.

Application for Amended Certificate of Authority - Fee of \$40 plus \$2 for each \$1,000 of excess capital on which fees have not previously been paid.
